The Lord's Prayer - Large Catechism

"We have now heard what we must do (10 Commandments) and believe (Apostle's Creed), in what things the best and happiest life consists. Now follows the third part, how we ought to pray... Nothing is more necessary than that we should continually turn towards God's ear, call upon Him, and pray to Him. We must pray that He would give, preserve, and increase faith in us and the fulfillment of the Ten Commandments. We pray that He would remove everything that is in our way and that opposes us in these matters. So that we might know what and how to pray, our Lord Christ has Himself taught us both the way and the words, as we shall see" (232).

The Introduction

Our Father who art in heaven.

What does this mean? With these words God tenderly invites us to believe that He is our true Father and that we are His true children, so that with all boldness and confidence we may ask Him as dear children ask their dear father.

Encouragement to Prayer

Before Martin Luther begins explaining the Lord's Prayer, he wants to encourage and stir people to prayer with three different reasons.

1) God's commandment and our obedience

The Second Commandment, "You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain," includes *calling* upon God's name in every need, and this is nothing other than *praying*. God has commanded us to pray. Luther writes, "prayer is not left to my will to do it or leave it undone, but it shall and must be offered at the risk of God's wrath and displeasure" (234).

Yet what stands between us and God's commandment is our sinful, human heart that flees from God and imagines that He doesn't wish or desire to hear our prayer because we are sinners deserving his wrath. Against such thoughts Luther reminds us that even though we are sinners, God 1) will not cast us away from Him or chase us away, but that He will 2) draw us to Himself that we might humble ourselves before Him, bewail our sin, and pray for grace and help.

Therefore, we can count on prayer. It doesn't depend on our holiness or worthiness, but on God's commandment. "God does not consider prayer because of the person, but because of His Word and obedience to it" (237). He will not allow our prayers to be in vain or lost, for "if He did not intend to answer your prayer, He would not ask you to pray and add such a severe commandment to it" (238).

2) God's promise and our delight

God adds His promise that it shall be done for us as we pray and "He testifies with His own Word that our prayer is heartily pleasing to Him" (238).

Psalm 50:15, "Call upon Me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you."

Matthew 7:7-8, "Ask, and it will be given to you; ... for everyone who asks receives."

3) God's arrangement and our assurance

God has arranged the words and form of prayer for us in the Lord's Prayer (Matthew 6). "He places them on our lips for how and what we should pray, so that we may see how heartily He pities us in our distress, and we may never doubt that such prayer is pleasing to Him and shall certainly be answered" (239). It's a noble prayer that God loves to hear. It helps us see and consider the distress that should compel us to pray without ceasing. "We all have enough things that we lack. The great problem is that we do not feel or recognize this. Therefore, God also requires that you weep and ask for such needs and wants, not because He does not know about them, but so that you may kindle your heart to stronger and greater desires and make wide and open your cloak to receive much" (241).

The Content of Prayer

Now that Luther has set stirred up people to prayer, he sets forth what the content of our prayers should be. "He should pray whenever he notices anything affecting his interests or that of other people among whom he may live" (241). This includes preachers, the government, neighbors, and household servants. The indifference that makes men unfit for prayer is overcome by attention to God's commandment and promise.

The Protection of Prayer

We are too weak on our own to deal with the devil, his power, and those who set themselves against us. But God has given us the spiritual weapons of God's Word and prayer with which we can defend ourselves. "All our shelter and protection rest in prayer alone" (241). So let us value prayer as something great and precious with the 1) assurance that He loves to hear us, the 2) delight that He promises to answer us, and the 3) encouragement that He has commanded us to pray!

Thanks to the support of churches and citizens of Smithville the Born Again Emporium has started 2024 with record sales. And record sales equals supporting various charities

In the past 10 years the Born Again Emporium has given a total of \$930,000 to Smithville charities. The BAE has only 2 paid employees – 2 men to help with the heavy lifting. The Emporium relies strictly on volunteers from the participating churches and the community. Thirteen churches are currently serving this ministry - providing volunteers for 4 days every 6 to 7 weeks. During their most recent board meeting grants totaling \$48,000 was distributed to the following organizations. Smithville Police Association received funds to purchase 2 body cameras with quarterly grants approved for purchasing more equipment. Smithville Community Clinic, Meals on Wheels. Smithville Education Foundation also received grants. Project Graduation also received a grant to assure a safe environment for our 2024 graduates celebration. National Mission Grant Bulletin Bytes: Sharing Christ Crucified with High School Youth -- \$35,000

Lutheran High School of Greater New Orleans, the only high school in the LCMS Southern District, has been serving youth for over 50 years. It provides students with the opportunity to academically succeed in a safe environment, while educating them about their Lord and Savior through the teachings of the LCMS. Many of the students being served by the school are disadvantaged, culturally diverse, and unchurched.

Because the school was devastated by Hurricane Ida, funds which would have been used for computers, school supplies, Christian materials, and scholarship aid are now being used for construction costs to rebuild one of the buildings.

This grant will be matched by five generous donors and will be used to pay the tuition costs of ten students.


